1. P1 enrolment 2021 – many of you are aware that our school is located in an area with numerous other primary schools. You may also be aware that Forge Integrated PS, currently located close to Wellington College, plans to move onto the old Knockbreda High School site within the next couple of years. Whilst I wish all local schools & their families well, I am concerned about the impact of this future development upon our school. I'm also concerned about the reducing numbers of children enrolling into our P1class & how this affects our school. In 2014, our school enrolment was 152. By 2017 it was 181. Today it is 165. In a nutshell, too many families from the immediate area are sending their children to other schools – often because they see those schools as being more 'middle class' or superior in some other way. I can say with certainty that Cregagh Primary School out-performs most of its neighbouring schools, provides unparalleled pastoral support to its pupils & their families, & has a dedicated staff that works for the good of the children & not just because "it's their job" to do so. Cregagh Primary School can only stay in 'good health' if its local area supports it by sending us their children to care for & educate.

Please help us spread the good reputation of Cregagh Primary School far & wide. Share our new promotional video on social media with your friends & families, ask us for a school prospectus & give it to a family of school-aged children you know, & most importantly, recommend us! If we want Cregagh Primary School to reach its 100th birthday in nineteen years' time, we need the local community to proactively support the school & help protect its future. COVID - Information for Parents & Carers

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & CARER

Everyone has a role to play in keeping our schools safe and helping to stop the spread of COVID-19.

OR

DON'T SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL IF THEY HAVE COVID-19 SYMPTOMS.

VISIT NIDIRECT.GOV.UK/ **CORONAVIRUS TO BOOK A** TEST ONLINE. CALL 119 IF YOU CANNOT BOOK A TEST ONLINE.

YOU SHOULD BOOK A COVID-19 TEST IF YOUR CHILD HAS:

A HIGH **TEMPERATURE**

This means they feel hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure their temperature).

CONTINUOUS COUGH

This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).

A LOSS OR CHANGE TO THEIR SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE

This means they've noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT HAVE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 BUT HAS OTHER COLD-LIKE SYMPTOMS, SUCH AS A RUNNY NOSE, THEY DO NOT NEED TO BE TESTED AND THEY OR MEMBERS OF YOUR HOUSEHOLD DO NOT NEED TO SELF-ISOLATE. YOUR CHILD CAN ATTEND SCHOOL IF FIT TO DO SO.

HERE'S WHAT TO DO IF:

YOUR CHILD HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHARACTER TO SCHOOL Book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform school immediately about test result

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school if the test is negative providing they are well enough, have not had a fever for 48 hours and if they haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

YOUR CHILD FOR COVID-19

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD
- Inform school immediately about test result
- Self-isolate for at least 10 days as advised by the PHA.

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school after 10 days even if they still have a cough / loss of smell or taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks.

SOMEBODY IN MY HOUSEHOLD HAS COVID-19 SYMPT

OR

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO
- The household member shoul book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform school immediately about test result

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school if the symptomatic household member's test is negative and if they haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

SOMEBODY IN MY HOUSEHOLD TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO
- Inform school immediately about test result

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when they have completed 14 days of selfisolation without any symptoms*.

CONTACT TRACING HAS IDENTIFIED MY CHILD AS A CLOSE CONTACT

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL
- Self-isolate for at least 14 days as advised by the PHA Contact Tracing Service

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when they have completed 14 days of selfisolation without any symptoms*.

YOUR CHILD HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS A CLOSE CONTAC

- Attend school as normal
- If your child does not have any COVID-19 symptoms they should carry on with normal activities.

YOUR CHILD HAS TRAVELLED ABROAD AND HAS TO SELE--ISOLATE

WHAT TO DO?

- DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL
- Self-isolate for 14 days in line with quarantine advice

WHEN CAN MY CHILD RETURN?

Your child can return to school when

*If your child has been identified as a close contact of a case of COVID-19, or has returned from travel abroad and is self-isolating, they must self-isolate for 14 days regardless of a negative COVID-19
