- Poppy's Garden** - We are excited to announce we are a grantee of the AXA PARKS Fund! The £19,000 grant will support our project to develop a new school garden to the rear of the school grounds. These new gardens will provide our pupils space to grow flowers, fruit and vegetables and learn about nature. When finished, the gardens will be officially dedicated to the memory of our lovely Poppy Ogle. This new space will be enjoyed by all our children, present and future, and will named, "Poppy's Garden".
- Sure Start @ Cregagh Primary School** – I'm also delighted to say that Sure Start will be 'anchor tenants' in our new Family Resource Centre. Sure Start offers support to parents with children aged under four years old. Their support programmes can help a parent from pregnancy until their child starts school. With Sure Start's ongoing support, a child can do well at school and flourish at home. Sure Start will be on site every Tuesday and Thursday. Great to have them on-board!
- Children being picked up late after school** – still having trouble with this one! Parents need to collect their children from school on time every day. If a child who gets picked up from school finishes at 2pm, their parent/carer should be waiting for them from 1:55pm. Similarly, for those children finishing at 3pm. If a child is repeatedly left late in school, we will have no option but to report this to family services. Remember, if some kind of disaster befalls you and is going to keep you late 5 minutes, let Miss Murphy know. Thanks ☺
- Two-to-Three Club users** – we are now asking parents who send their children to Two-to-Three Club to collect their children from the Clocktower area at the front of school at 3pm. We believe this will be easier for the majority of parents.
- Is your child entitled to Free School Meals?** For every eligible child registered for Free School Meals (regardless of whether they ever take them or not), schools in N.I. receive additional funding. If you think your children are eligible, please register – it is a big help to the school's creaking finances! If you need help, Lois (our Family Engagement Worker ☎ 07526915747) is happy to help.
- Attendance target for all pupils 2022-23** – The Department of Education (NI) states that a child with an attendance record of 95% is only just "satisfactory", as 95% means that 9 days of learning have been lost. As a school, we want to see all children in school every day and on time. Missing days of school or being late for reasons that could easily be avoided sends a message to children that school and education "doesn't really matter"; children only get one shot at school; help them make the most of their opportunity ☺
- Healthy breaks, no nuts and water only** – our school has a Healthy Break Policy: only healthy break foods can be eaten Monday-Thursday. On Fridays, children can bring a 'sweet treat' to school if they so choose. Children may only bring water to school to drink for break and lunch (not diluted juice). Visit our school website for some healthy break ideas. Our school pupils' dental health was among the worst in East Belfast 20 years ago, now it's among the best. Lastly, please remember we are a 'nut free' school due to some children and staff having allergies. Thanks.
