4. School Money App & School Dinners

Please note that from 1st March 2024, a new "Arrears Limit" of £10 will be introduced. This will mean that where a school dinners account falls into arrears of more than £10, the system will not allow parents to book future meals until any existing arrears are cleared.

5. Why are pupils only allowed to bring water to school to drink?

The NHS states that, "The best drinks to give children are water and milk. Children should drink whole milk until they're 2 years old. Children should avoid sugary fizzy drinks, squash and juice drinks completely. Children who drink a lot of sugary drinks are more likely to become overweight. 6. Every School Day Counts !

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning. Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	EXCELLENT
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	SATISFACTORY
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	POOR
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.

7. No Electric Scooters or e-Bikes in School

It is a school rule that our pupils are not permitted to bring electric scooters or bicycles to school.

- a) They are more dangerous than ordinary scooters and bikes;
- b) They are at greater risk of being stolen as they are so valuable.
