## 3. COVID & Illness Update

This week vomiting and diarrhoea seems to have been a bigger problem than Covid (although we have had children and staff off with Covid this week too). Please remember that any child who has vomiting and diarrhoea must, in accordance with DE & PHA directives, stay off school for two full days following their last episode. This is to stop bugs spreading. We will also need to keep a close eye on Covid numbers in school as children start to mix a little more with other year groups in after school clubs etc.

## 4. Ukraine conflict & Save the Children

On Wednesday 16th March, we are holding a 'Blue & Yellow' day in school when children are encouraged to wear blue & yellow clothes to school. Everything they wear could be blue & yellow; or just a few items. Alternatively, a mismatched pair of blue/yellow socks could be worn. For those dressing in blue and yellow, normal school uniform doesn't have to be worn on this special day.

All proceeds will be donated to SAVE THE CHILDREN who are in Ukraine working with families and also supporting those trying to escape the conflict. We know rising household bills means that money is tight in many homes right now but where possible, we would ask families to try and donate £1 for each child - or just whatever they can afford right now  $\bigcirc$ . If a family cannot make a donation, we would still like to see the children come to school in blue and yellow.

Our school's PUPIL COUNCIL will also be selling donuts for 50p on this same day to help raise funds. We hope you can support the children's efforts, many of whom have expressed a desire and willingness to do something to help Ukrainian children.
