# 1. Carol Service & Carols Around the Christmas Tree

CAROL SERVICE – our school's Carol Service is held in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Rosetta) every year. This year it's being held on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December at 7pm. Due to the size of the church building and fire regulations, we must manage the number of people attending. We do this through tickets. Cregagh Primary School pupils do not, of course, need tickets to attend but everyone else does. Each family will be sent 4 tickets initially; if one or two more are required, parents can contact the school office and leave their name with Miss Murphy who will compile a list. If anyone does not need all 4 of their tickets, please return any spares to school. These will then be shared with families who have requested extra tickets. Carol Service tickets must be shown at the door upon entry. The congregation of St. Andrew's are providing a light supper after the Carol Service; please keep your own children supervised during this time: especially when they are choosing food from the tables. There will a collection for charity at the end of the night in favour of Cregagh's own *TeamDot*, please bring whatever you can to donate to this brilliant cause which is very dear to all our hearts.

CAROLS AROUND THE CHRISTMAS TREE – this event takes place outside in our playground area on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> December at 6:15pm. Like the Carol Service, each family will be given 4 tickets for this event. Pupils don't need tickets. Should any families want extra tickets, please let Miss Murphy know and we will try our best. Entrance to this event will be via the school's rear yellow gates. Tickets must be shown at the gate (this is to make sure no one who would spoil the event gains access). The school building will be closed to children and families on this evening but our friends at Cregagh Community Centre will be providing access to the centre's toilets. School staff will be selling hot drinks & some sweet things for School Fund – so please try and support us by purchasing something. There will also be a collection for the **TeamDot** charity at the close of the event. Remember to wrap up warm!

  <u>Most people love dogs ... most people ...</u> but we do have some children in our school who, for various reasons, are <u>very afraid</u> of dogs. Only Guide Dogs are permitted on school grounds. Parents should not bring their dogs to school at drop-off or pick-up times, as this will bring them into close contact with our pupils.

Dogs Fouling Outside School Gates/Fence – this continues to be an issue. Mr Dickson our caretaker, checks that the areas around our school gates are clean every morning but all that is needed is for one careless dog owner to walk by, not pick-up after their dog and we're back to square one. It's disgusting and dangerous in areas that are frequented by young children. *Please contact your local councillors and MLAs and ask them to do more about helping with this problem – particularly putting up two new dog bins at the two lampposts either side of our back yellow gates. Your help with these doggy problems would be appreciated!*

- We all know that things are tight right now. We have been doing what we can to help including: cutting the cost of Breakfast Club by over half and school paying for buses for all classes who go for swimming lessons.
